DISCIPLINE

As per the CBSE guidelines "Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no such act will go unnoticed or unpunished. "To ensure smooth functioning and decorous ambience of the school, all the students are expected to follow the norms mentioned below. Any diversion from the desirable behaviour may trigger serious action against the deviant student.

ANTICIPATED BEHAVIOUR / CONDUCT	DEVIANT OR UNACCEPTED BEHAVIOUR / CONDUCT
1. Regularity (Daily presence)	1. Erratic attendance (absence without prior information)
2. Punctuality	2. Late coming/ Absence from class
3. Neat and tidy school uniform; neatly combed hair	3. Improper and untidy uniform/appearance; untidy and uncombed long hair
4. Attention / diligence in the class room	4. Inattentiveness in the class / irregular homework
5. Maintenance of school property	5. Damaging school property
6. Respectful / cordial behaviour with teachers and peers	6. Undesirable/unlawful behaviour such as fighting within or outside the school premises, using abusive language, swearing, stealing, pushing etc.

This remedial system is an alternative to discourage corporal punishment towards the students.

The following stages of action against misconduct by students will be undertaken depending on the degree and frequency of the offence.

❖ **Stage 1** Intimation of misconduct of the child to the parents:

- On observation by the teachers, of the misconduct by the student, the matter will be reported to the coordinator and a detailed record of the same will be maintained.
- These incidents will be reported to the class teacher, who will then issue a **WHITE CARD** to the student in the presence of the parents
- If these preliminary warnings go unheeded or with no corrective measures taken, then this will result in the matter being reported to the Principal and issue of a **YELLOW CARD**

❖ **Stage 2** A yellow card denotes 2 very serious reminders or warnings for misconduct followed by conditional grant of pardon.

- The student may be detained from class for 2 or 3 days and a **RED CARD** will be issued with a reminder
- If no corrective measures are taken, it may lead to direct suspension from the school.

MERIT CERTIFICATE ASSESSMENT (only for Std VII & IX)

To motivate students to excel in Academics and to make a mark for themselves as groomed all-rounders, the Merit Certificate will be awarded to the deserving students.

❖ **Merit Certificate Assessment Details:**

- It is conducted once a year.
- It consists of comprehensive set of questions to test the Academic and Co-curricular Skills.

❖ **Eligibility Criteria for the Merit Certificate Assessment:**

- The eligible student must score above 95% in final exam & the highest grade in all co-scholastic activities .
- The student should appear for all scholastic and co-scholastic activities conducted throughout the year.
- The eligible students will then have to appear for the Written Exam.
