
Dear Parents Greetings!!

Wishing all the students GOOD LUCK for their exams!!



MENTAL GYMNASTICS COMPETITION

Mathematics is the most beautiful and most powerful creation of the human spirit. To enhance student's mathematical skills, to gain confidence and create interest in the subject the school had organized the Mental Gymnastics Competition for students of std 1 to std 7. The competition which started from the second week of October was conducted in three rounds. The first round was in the form of a google form wherein each participant was given 20 questions which tested upon the competencies in several mathematical calculations and logical reasoning. The students selected from this round went for a puzzle round i.e. the second round wherein they applied their problem solving skills to crack the puzzles. The next round was the rapid fire round wherein the qualified students answered a shot of 10 questions based on mental maths in the given time limit.



The Winners were awarded with prizes, gold medal and certificates. Children really had a nice time after a long break and enthusiastically participated in all the rounds. Such events in Math would really motivate students to enhance their mental ability skills, logical thinking skills, speed and accuracy in computations and boost their interest in the subject.

The first round was conducted through the Google Form. The students attempted the questions enthusiastically. This was then followed by declaring the results of Round – I who have qualified for the Round -II.


All the participants were awarded the participation -E-certificates as a mark of encouragement and motivation




Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on this Science Day, has urged all the families to definitely start with small efforts to develop a scientific temperament in their children.

"Languages are the most powerful instruments of preserving and developing our tangible and intangible heritage."


