They collected and deposited the plastic waste of all kinds from their homes in the large plastic collecting units.



As a part of 'Free from Plastic Drive' the Environment Club had placed large plastic collecting units on both A and B wings from floors 1 to 5 to facilitate the easy disposal of the plastics collected by the students.

Auxiliary staff provided a great support in collection and storing of the plastic waste during the drive.



On 30th June ,2022 awareness programme on plastic waste was organized by the school. School Principal, Cultural Coordinators and Mr. Bhatu Sawant CEO of Samarth Bharath Vyasapeeth graced the occasion.
